



When connecting your Mac to a wireless network, one of the first things you'll want to do is make sure that the AirPort icon is enabled in your Menu bar. If it's already there, please to Step 5.





Select the Apple **Button** (very upper left corner of your screen) and choose **System Preferences...** from the drop-down list. From there, select **Network**.





Select you AirPort entry, and click the **Configure...** button.




Make sure the **Airport** tab is selected from the top menu, and then place a check in the box labelled **Show AirPort status in menu bar**

Click the AirPort icon in your menu bar. Select the Create Network...

Enter "Carilion-AppNet" into the "Network Name:" field. Select "WPA2 Enterprise" in the "Security:" field. Enter your AD user ID into the "Username:" field. Enter your AD password into the "Password:" field. Then click on "Join".

Click on "Continue"

Enter the user ID you use to log in the the MAC with in the "Name:" field and the password for that account into the "Password:" field and click on "Update Settings".



When you're connected, the AirPort icon will change from a 'light grey' color to a solid black. The number of solid black lines indicates the **signal strength** (more black bars = stronger signal).
